Getting Started

Assess your skills and potential remote career options

- Action: Create a list of your top skills and research how they translate to remote work. For example, if you're a graphic designer, look into freelance design platforms like 99designs or Dribbble.
- Example: A teacher might transition to online tutoring or course creation on platforms like VIPKid or Udemy.

Build an emergency fund (3-6 months of expenses)

- Action: Calculate your monthly expenses and set up an automatic savings plan to reach your goal.
- Example: If your monthly expenses are \$2000, aim for a fund of \$6000-\$12000 before departing.

Develop a location-independent income stream

- Action: Start a side hustle while still in your current job to test viability.
- Example: Begin freelance writing on platforms like Upwork or Fiverr to build a client base.

Minimize debt and financial obligations

- Action: Create a debt repayment plan. Consider selling unnecessary possessions.
- Example: Use the debt snowball method to pay off smaller debts first for quick wins.

Research visa requirements for potential destinations

- Action: Make a list of your top 5 desired destinations and research their visa policies.
- Example: If you're interested in Bali, look into Indonesia's new Digital Nomad Visa which allows stays of up to 5 years.

Essential Preparations

Obtain necessary vaccinations and health check-ups

- Action: Schedule a travel clinic appointment at least 6 weeks before departure.
- Example: For Southeast Asia, you might need vaccinations for Hepatitis A, Typhoid, and Japanese Encephalitis

Secure comprehensive travel and health insurance

- Action: Compare plans from providers like World Nomads or SafetyWing that cater to digital nomads.
- Example: Look for plans that cover adventure activities if you plan on trying new sports abroad.

Organize important documents (passport, visas, licenses)

- Action: Create both physical and digital copies of all important documents.
- Example: Use a secure cloud storage service like Dropbox to store scanned copies of your passport, driver's license, and birth certificate.

Set up a virtual mailbox service

- Action: Research services like Earth Class Mail or Traveling Mailbox and choose one that fits your needs.
- Example: Set up mail forwarding for important documents and have non-essential mail scanned and emailed to you.

Establish a reliable banking system for international use

- Action: Open an account with a bank known for international services, like Charles Schwab or TransferWise.
- Example: Get a credit card with no foreign transaction fees, like the Chase Sapphire Preferred.
